A new position in Leo Clubs/Districts/Multiple Districts that will be responsible for membership development at the club/district/multiple district level





Why retention is important?

No members = No service


Losing members is an issue for many clubs, and the reasons members leave are often the same. The four areas that are most influential on why someone may leave a club include the following:

- 1. Club conflict is the number one reason Lions club members leave.
- 2. Feeling like they are not making a difference.
- 3. Not having a sense of belonging.
- 4. Lack of involvement in club's activities and service projects



Why retention is important?

- To retain members in our clubs we must ensure that they:
 are able to take pride in service activities.
 have confidence that they are "making a difference".
 are informed about the club's objectives
- We can use the Global Membership Approach to engage members to foster a strong membership culture

Leo Online Courses, Networking & Forums: many useful online courses to further develop both soft and hard skills, together with forums and networking possibilities to connect with Leos all over the world



Leo Grants: LCIF service grants are available to districts and multiple districts in different amounts to address unmet humanitarian needs in their community and the association provides leadership grants to support Leo training



ELLI Grant: Funds are available to support opportunities for Leos and Lions to learn together and from each other as participants of the Emerging Lions Leadership Institute. To help offset the cost to Leos, the ELLI Leo Grant was created to encourage Leos to attend ELLI. Funds are available for Multiple Districts, Single Districts and/or Undistricted Areas.



Leo-Lion Cultural Exchange Ambassador Scholarships: gives an opportunity to connect and share experiences as Leo-Lions with members all over the world


- Current or former Leos between the age of legal majority through age 35 who have served for at least a year and a day.

SCHOLARSHIPS

LEO-LION CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Leo-Lion Cultural Exchange Ambassadors have an opportunity to connect and share their experiences as Leo-Lions with members all over the world. With the financial support of the Cultural Exchange Ambassador Scholarships, one Leo-Lion from each constitutional area (CA) will be assigned to a CA Lions forum other than their own to gain fresh perspectives and new ideas on leadership and service, while learning about the rich culture of people living in that region of the world.



Qualified Leo-Lion Cultural Exchange Ambassador Scholarship candidates are members in good standing in active Lions clubs, and have successfully completed reported terms in any of the following leadership positions:

- Leo club officer
- Leo district or multiple district president
- District or multiple district Leo chairperson
- Lions club officer

Candidates must also:

- o Possess current qualified travel documents (those without should be able to and willing to process the required travel documents within the timeframe).
- Be available during the dates of the assigned forum.
- Commit to attending a forum that is assigned to them after written confirmation of acceptance.
- Submit the Leo-Lion scholarship by the deadline noted on the Leo-Lion Program webpage.

LEO-LION



The Leo-Lion Cultural Exchange Ambassador Scholarship is a financial reimbursement program. Recipients will be reimbursed a maximum of US\$2,625.00 for eligible expenses incurred as a result of participation in this program. Eligible expenses include travel (airfare, train tickets, etc.), meals during travel days to and from the forum, and meals and lodging during forum dates. Recipients of the Leo-Lion Cultural Exchange Ambassador Scholarship will be required to submit their receipts from their forum to be eligible for reimbursement. Personal item expenses and additional travel costs not related to the program will not be reimbursed by the Leo-Lion Cultural Exchange Ambassador Scholarship.









BRIEF FRAMEWORK





LEOS

- Participate in educational sessions and workshops to understand the benefits of becoming Leo-Lions.
- **Engage** in mentorship programs to receive guidance from experienced Leo-Lions, Leo Advisory Panelists or Lions club members.
- **Explore** leadership opportunities within the Lions organization and contribute to joint events.
- **Explore** Leo-Lion resources on the Lions Learning Center.



BRIEF FRAMEWORK-CONTINUATION





- Oversee initiation and ongoing development of the Leo club.
- Report Leo club officers and members and the Leo club's service activities.
- **Train** Leo club officers to use the reporting system.
- Promote collaboration between Leos and sponsoring Lions club by regularly updating Lions on Leo club activities.
- Attend Leo club and board of directors' meetings.
- Ensure new Leos receive new member materials and orientation.
- Recognize Leos for their achievements.
- Encourage eligible Leos to become Lions.

BRIEF FRAMEWORK-CONTINUATION







- Engage in collaborative planning with Leo club Advisors and District Leo Chairpersons.
- Advocate for the value of Leo-Lions within the Lions club and community.
- Highlight leadership opportunities available for Leo-Lions within the Lions organization.

BRIEF FRAMEWORK



DISTRICT LEO CHAIRPERSON



❖ Encourage graduating Leos to join an existing Leo-Lion or Lions club or form a new Leo-Lion or Lions club; work closely with Leos and Leo Club Advisors in the District to ensure that graduating Leos are aware of the many incentives and options available to former Leos who become Lions







LEO ADVISORY PANELISTS / LEO-LION BOARD LIAISON

- Collaborate with staff from the Young Lions and Leos Department to develop educational resources
- Organize trainings to help with the smooth transition
- Collaborate with District and Multiple District Leo Chairpeople







DISTRICT GOVERNOR

- Mentorship and Motivating Leos on significance of transitioning and benefits involved.

CA 1 is the home of 536 Leo-Lions with District 60 leading with their Leo to Lion transition program.








- Very inspiring success story of Leo-Lion Sol Flores who is 31 from MD 301 in Philippines from CA 5.
