#### FIGHTING FOR THE TREES



Deforestation, a rapidly growing problem, takes the homes from wildlife and affects entire ecosystems, weather patterns, air quality, and the climate. Forests are the habitat for 80 percent

of land animals; each year, we lose more trees, and more animal species go extinct.

Desiring to make a difference in their community, Lions in Korea adopted the environment cause area and are tackling this critical issue. In Lions Forest has added tremendous value to the community.
