HOME AWAY FROM HOME



The moment you learn your child has cancer turns your world upside down. Your life now revolves around doctor appointments, medical treatments, and supporting your child. In Japan, families of more

than 2,000 children hear this news each year². However, thanks to Lions and Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), families with children receiving treatment in Kobe City no longer need to focus on their living situation and can instead focus on their children.

Parents who travel far distances for their child's treatment often do not want to leave their youngster to return home, nor can they afford to stay in a hotel for long periods. For this reason, Child Chemo House was established. Overnight accommodations include everything a home has. Families can relax, cook, spend

time together, and sleep while their children receive treatment.

A LOIF Matching grant updated the home away from home.

Local Lions knew Child Chemo House needed

upgrades. With a LCIF Matching grant of more than US\$16,000, Lions provided new furniture, kitchen and cleaning appliances, and audio-visual equipment. The updated facility is now a home away from home for approximately 270 people each year.
