Evolution Of The Lions Litter Clean-Up Projects

2014: First adopt-a-mile inspired by a neighboring club

2014: First organized litter clean-up

2015: Appointed to Keep Cobb (County) Beautiful Board Of Directors by our county commissioner

2015-2022: Current adopted seven additional miles and sold the adopt-a-mile to 34 other organizations in the area increasing our club's exposure and influence. Litter has been reduced by half. In the 2021 Litter Index survey we were the cleanest of the four Cobb County Districts.

2022: Cobb County Chairwoman donated \$500 leftover from her unspent campaign funds to our club


Tips For Success







- 2. Subscribe to newsletters and associations such as Keep America Beautiful.
- 3. Document each event with pictures and results. Social media can serve as a great place to share and store your accomplishments.
- 4. Try to get the Lions Club message out to the public. Carry Lions Club pamphlets or business cards with you as you conduct your litter clean-ups for when you encounter grateful residents and citizens. We wear our Lions Club Safety Vests as we conduct our litter clean-ups.
- 5. Partner with other civic organizations during their litter clean-ups so that you can find other common interests and projects.
