| DIA16819/43 Y                | UNITED STATES   | <i>Bluegrass Lions Diabetes Project</i><br>The grant will help prevent diabetes and improve the lives of people living with diabetes and pre-diabetes throughout the county through screening, referral and education activities. Through the grant, at least 3,000 at-risk individuals will be screened, at least 300 retinal screenings will be performed and over 25 Lions will be trained. | US\$67,500    |

Through the grant, 155 multidisciplinary healthcare professionals will be trained, at least 2,400 patients with diabetes will be educated on diabetes management and 80 children and youth will attend a type 1 diabetes camp. | US\$64,852 |
| DIA16673/300 F  | REP OF CHINA (MD 300 Taiwan) | <i>Diabetes Community Educators and Screening</i><br>The grant will provide healthcare materials and training to Lions so that they can become diabetes community educators. This program aims to reach 130,000 individuals by deploying the diabetes educators back to their communities, where they can provide knowledge about the disease and screen those who are at risk.  | \$90,200   |
| DIA16814/308 B2 | MALAYSIA                     | <i>Kedah Diabetes Awareness Program</i><br>The grant will provide screening for 5,000 individuals living in Malaysia, where the prevalence rate of diabetes is one of the highest in the world. The Lions will conduct 33 different screening events, hoping to bring awareness to the disease and help those currently undiagnosed but living with diabetes.  | \$10,000   |
| DIA16861/332 F  | JAPAN                        | <i>Type 1 Diabetes Camp, Yokote City</i><br>The grant will support a three day, two night camp for children and adolescents living with type 1 diabetes. | DIA16879/325A2 | NEPAL | <i>Expand Dhulikhel Hospital Lions Diabetes Center</i><br>The grant will expand comprehensive diabetes care services at Dhulikhel Hospital by equipping the hospital with podiatry equipment allowing them provide diabetic foot care to at least 1,200 patients. The grant also provide training to one physician in endocrinology, two nurses as diabetes educators and two nurses in diabetic foot care. | \$105,358  |
| DIA16667/325B2 | NEPAL | <i>Diabetes Screening, Education and Awareness in Rupandehi</i><br>The grant will improve the quality of life for pre-diabetic and diabetic adults through screening, education and awareness. Through the grant 325 screening events, with at least 161,447 individuals screened and at least 451,335 individuals will be educated on diabetes prevention and management.                                  | \$80,013   |

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| DIA16726/411 B | UGANDA | <i>Diabetes Awareness, Screening and Treatment in Teso Sub-Region</i><br>The grant will expand and improve diabetes diagnostic, treatment and management services in Teso sub-region by renovating one diabetes care center and equipping three district hospitals with diabetes diagnostic and treatment equipment. The project will also provide refresher training to 60 medical staff and diabetes association members and will train 60 Lions as community diabetes liaisons. The project will also organize 159 screening events at which 80,000 individuals are targeted to be screened. | US\$140,986 |
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
