## Lions International Honors Chef José Andrés and World Central Kitchen with Humanitarian Award

(Oak Brook, III) - For his dedication to humanitarian service and world hunger relief, Chef José Andrés, Michelin star culinary artist and founder of the World Central Kitchen nonprofit organization, will be presented with the 2023 Lions Humanitarian Award during the 105th Lions Clubs International Convention on July 10, 2023.
